 - We have purpose and meaning here and now.

 - The church is the adopted family in which we encourage and support one another.
 - The Sacrament of Baptism is the beginning of a person's spiritual journey as a child in the family of God. One baptism is sufficient in a person's life. There are, however, other times when it is appropriate to renew baptismal vows as a person gains a fresh perspective on God's grace. Baptism can be administered to an infant or an adult. While all forms of water baptism are accepted, we sprinkle.
 - The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper represents the sacrificial body and blood of Christ and recalls the last meal shared with the Apostles. The elements on the plate and in the cup symbolize the New Covenant between God and His people. We celebrate this sacrament monthly as our faith is renewed and we are strengthened for our spiritual journey.
